
Hello all,


2301 Kelbrook Court, and it works ... very easy.

Here are the steps:

- www.duke-energy.com
- Click on the state of Florida at the top left of page
- Click on the Magnifying glass icon at the top right of page
- Type in STREET LIGHT at the top where you see "HAVE A QUESTION? TYPE IT HERE
- You will see a menu with common questions ... Select HOW DO I REPORT A STREETLIGHT THAT DOESN'T WORK?
- The next screen looks like this:



- Click on the work here
- Scroll down and just above the Google Earth map on the left, type in your address
 - Be sure to put your street, city, state (no zip is necesary)
- You will now see your community, street, house (marked), and streetlight icons
- Select the streetlight location that is out




- A new window will pop-up, and fill this out. This will record the report, and you can reference it at any time for updates
- You can see how when went in again, it shows a report record
- Duke estimates 3-5 business days for repair

Anyone can do this, rather than report to me, which will only add time to getting things done.
